



CARBERRY TOWER

MANSION HOUSE AND ESTATE



One of Scotland's great mansion houses, which once provided a childhood holiday home for the Queen, is now a luxurious destination for visitors from across the world.

In 1567 on Carberry Hill (which can be seen from the south lawns) Mary Queen of Scots surrendered to the Scottish lords before being imprisoned in Loch Leven Castle. The Queen's Mount still stands on Carberry Hill commemorating the incident and as well as being able to see remains of the original earthworks dug into the hillside for defence at that time, there are also fabulous views over Edinburgh.

Sitting just 15 minutes' drive from the centre of Edinburgh, the hotel is perfectly positioned to give access to many places of interest related to the Mary Queen of Scots story, such as Edinburgh Castle, Hollyrood Palace, Traquair House, Inchmalcolm Priory and Craigmillar Castle.

Mary Queen of Scots Package

For groups of 20 to 30 people: Two nights accommodation with a full Scottish breakfast each morning and a 'Mary Queen of Scots Banquet' on the first night. A guided walk to 'Mary's Mount' on the edge of the Carberry Estate (approx. 40mins round trip) after breakfast on either day. **From £140 per person** (based on two people sharing an Executive room)

For individuals or groups less than 20 people: Two nights accommodation with a full Scottish breakfast each morning and Dinner in The Campaign Room Bistro on the first night. A map with directions to walk to 'Mary's Mount' on the edge of the Carberry Estate (approx. 40mins round trip). **From £170 per person** (based on two people sharing an Executive room)
